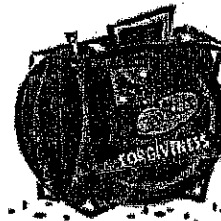

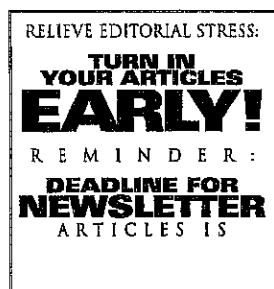
*You are confined to your home for an extended period of time because of illness or accident;

The slots are reserved for the Sixth North Lancaster Conference LDR Trip. There will be a planning meeting for this trip on Sunday, February 5th @ 2:00 p.m. I promise that everyone will be home long before kickoff! I am asking that anyone interested in attending this trip come to the meeting prepared to complete registration forms and to submit a deposit check in the amount of \$150.00 made out to: "North Lancaster Conference Dean's Fund." The first 50 volunteers registered will go on the trip!

Over 4000 homes (about 20%) in the city Minot were destroyed in June when the Souris River exceeded the limits of the city's levees at 1558 feet above sea level. They, like so many other parts of the country, are in desperate need of volunteers to put their homes and their lives back together again. Please consider requesting special offerings to help defray the cost of this trip. I am estimating that it will cost about \$750/person. 30 Hour Famine: Students fasting and fighting hunger

COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

18 January 2012

Your Council met Wednesday, January 18, 2012 in the library. Highlights include:

Boy Scouts reported they received a thank you from the OMPH Food Bank for the food drive they held in November. Boy Scout Sunday will be Sunday, February 5th. The Pinewood Derby will be held here Saturday, February 4th. They attended the Klondike Derby at Camp Mack.

Service committee reported that they will be holding a pig stomach dinner on Saturday April 21st and that the proceeds from this dinner will be donated to the youth going to the ELCA Youth Gathering in July. They are working with the Welcome committee to plan a senior citizen banquet to be held on Saturday March 24th. They are also investigating the possibility of opening a Peter's Porch food distribution location.

Love, Inc. reported that the steering committee is looking at 2 different rental properties that could be used as the next home. The monthly rental cost of the home would be split between the participating congregations.

Welcome committee reported that they mailed out 58 cards this month. They are working on the entertainment for the senior citizen banquet. They are hosting a family game night on February 25th from 6:00-9:00pm in the social hall. Everyone is invited. They are working on college student, mother's day and father's day gifts and also checking into more economical alternatives to the roses that we hand out to visitors.

Helping Hands committee reported that on February 9th from 6:00-9:00pm they are sponsoring a "Cooking for a Crowd" workshop by the Penn State Cooperative Extension to educate people on the safe preparation of foods. Anyone is welcome to attend, but preregistration is required. They will be preparing a light meal at 6:00pm before the Ash Wednesday Service on February 22nd. They are holding a soup sale on March 17th and they will be preparing Holy Week breakfasts this year.

Finance committee reported that the treasurers are attending a Synod sponsored seminar on church finances.

Internet committee reported that they are looking into the possibility of broadcasting our services to our sick and shut-ins. This committee is in need of members, if you are interested please see Tom Laudenslager or Guy Templin.

Property committee reported that they are diligently tackling the long list of items on their to-do list. The Farm All tractor has been sold for \$2000. They are looking into adding additional motion sensors in certain areas of the church. They are also looking into dumpster trash pickup versus weekly pickup. Additionally they are looking into replacing the sign out front and placing it perpendicular to the roadway instead of parallel to it as it is now.

Disaster Response committee reported that they attended a meeting held by Reverend Glenn Beard Jr. on the upcoming 5th annual disaster service trip. The group has decided to go to Minot, North Dakota April 22 - April 28.

Worship committee reported that they are looking into other flower options as well as other wine choices. Transfiguration Sunday will be on February 19 with Ash Wednesday service being held on February 22 at 7:00pm. All Wednesday Lenten Services will be held at 7:00pm with the collections going to the Habitat for Humanity house and to support a missionary in Southeast Asia. Maundy Thursday Service will be held at 7:00pm and the Good Friday Service will be held at 8:00pm. On Easter Sunday we will be having only two services a 6:00am Easter Dawn Service and an 8:30am Service. There will be a 7:00am breakfast held between the two services.

Organist/Choir Director Search committee reported they will be advertising for this position shortly and plan to have the new person(s) to start after Easter.

Youth Ministry reported there are 10 youth and advisors attending the Youth Gathering in New Orleans this summer. Their first fundraiser will be the Premier Jewelry party being held on February 16th at 7:00pm in the social hall. The youth are also participating in a 30-hour famine on February 24 -25 to raise money and awareness for Word Vision's world-wide work with children's hunger. Sunday February 5th will be "Souper" Bowl Sunday and the youth are asking the congregation to bring a can of soup and \$1 to church to be donated to the EASS.

Building update -There are still some items not completed by the contractor and discussions are continuing regarding some billing discrepancies. The final payment will be held until these issues are resolved.

SING TO THE LORD A NEW SONG!

Praise ye the Lord. Praise God in God's sanctuary.

This psalm reminds us that God loves music. This psalm instructs us to use music to love God. God created music as an integral part of all creation. "Everything that has breath" includes us. The most perfect instrument is the human voice. God created each and everyone of us with a voice, not only for speaking, but also for singing.

Today the culture and society in which we live offers us a myriad of choices in just about every facet of our lives. When I was growing up, one could get the week's groceries at the corner Cassel's store that would fit into any corner of today's super market. When I was growing up, the Common Service Book (the Lutheran Hymnal) had about 300 hymns in it. Today we have many more choices.

Having more choices, means there is the likelihood that a hymn will be selected that we do not know. Even the "gems" we gravitate to and sing with gusto were new at one time and no one had ever heard them before. Some congregation in Germany heard "A Mighty Fortress" for the first time. Some congregation in England heard "Amazing Grace" for the first time. Some congregation in America heard "Jesus Lover of My Soul" for the first time. But, did that preclude the congregation from singing the hymn?

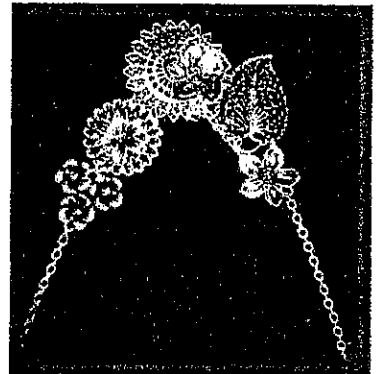
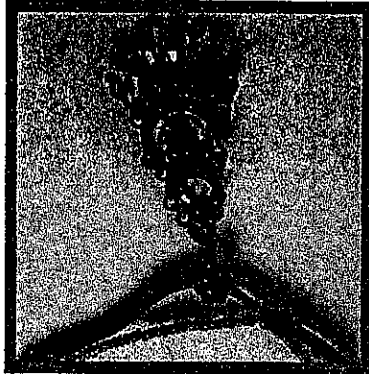
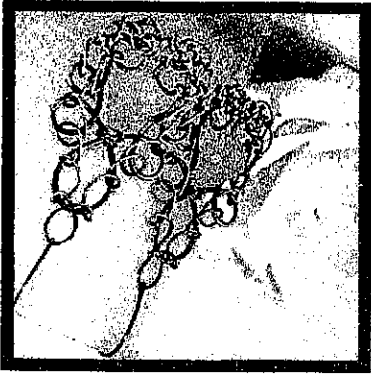
Congregational singing in the Lutheran church is as integral to the worship service as the Confession and Absolution. Congregational singing takes seriously Psalm 150. Try this the next time you hear an unfamiliar hymn. Listen to the music of the introduction to the hymn. Read the words in your mind as you sing "la, la, la" to the first verse. If the notes on the page go up, sing higher, if the notes on the page go down, sing lower, or say the words out loud and don't worry about the music. Ask yourself, what is the author of this hymn trying to say to us about our relationship with God? That is the point of writing any hymn anyway.

The service music is planned as part of an integrated whole that begins with the Gospel and other scriptural passages that support the Gospel. Remember, the scriptures tell us emphatically to "sing to the Lord a new song."

FORGIVENESS Game

Try this twist on musical chairs.

What you need:

- 28 large index cards
- Black marker
- Two teams of people
- Radio or CD player

What you do:

1. On index cards, write out *forgiveness*, one letter per card. Make two sets (two F's, two O's, etc.).
2. Mix up the cards and form them face up in a circle on the floor. (You'll have six blanks mixed in.)
3. Have teams mix themselves up and stand in a circle around the cards. Ask an extra person to turn the music on and off.
4. As the music plays, teams walk around the circle. When the music stops, players each pick up the card nearest them.
5. Team members take their cards to a designated area and try to spell forgiveness. Any double letters or blanks go back to the "music person," who reorganizes remaining cards, spacing them evenly into a fresh circle.
6. Play continues until one team spells *forgiveness*.

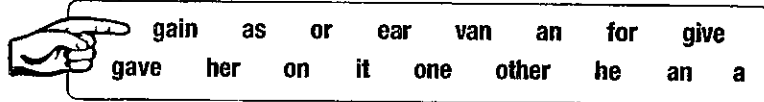

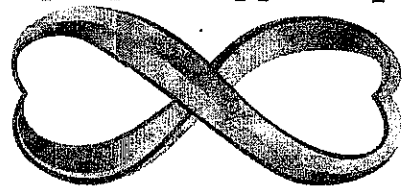

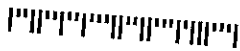
